
Yorkshire and Humber Children, Teenage and Young Adult Cancer Clinical Network Newsletter

The first issue is a brief introduction to the service with main contact points and dates for your diary.


Highlights in this issue include: our new website, network benchmarking visits and successful funding for ambulatory chemotherapy.

We are a diverse rural and urban region in England with a population of 5.4 million covering 15,000 sq km. Our network links 2 Principal Treatment Centres, 5 Paediatric Oncology Shared Care Units and 9 Designated Hospitals across Yorkshire, the Humber, North Lincolnshire & North Derbyshire, who together, provide cancer care to young people aged 0-25.


